Significant Activity in Audubon Park

November remained peaceful in Audubon Park. We took three reports for the month. The first report taken was following the death of a long-time resident who passed in her home after a lengthy illness. The second report was a hit and run collision where a vehicle that was parked on the roadway was sideswiped and had considerable damage to the sideview mirror. The final report was taken for the theft of 3 cases of specialty bourbon from an unlocked vehicle. On 11/29/2023, Kyle Durham was arrested on an outstanding warrant in relation to a theft from an unlocked motor vehicle that was reported to officers in June of this year. That case is pending in Jefferson Circuit Court. Edward Clefas has also been arrested for possession of the firearm that was stolen from that same unlocked vehicle. We are currently working with LMPD to link Clefas to the case involving Durham.

On 11/29/2023, Sergeant Scott Barto responded to a call for service. A male called in and reported that his mother, his brother, his two children and he had been held at gunpoint by his mother's ex-husband. He had managed to get out of the apartment safely with his two children and call for assistance. Sergeant Barto called LMPD for back-up and within minutes they were able to get the other two individuals out of the apartment without injury. The suspect was later taken into custody without incident and has been charged with unlawful imprisonment, wanton endangerment, assault 4 (Domestic Violence), Terroristic Threatening and Possession of a Handgun by a Convicted Felon. In addition to this fresh case, the suspect is facing revocation of his parole. He is currently on parole for a previous Murder charge. Sgt. Barto's actions on that day undoubtedly saved the victims from further injury and possible death.

This is just one example of the situations that your officers face and handle professionally in and around Audubon Park. Sgt. Barto should be commended for his handling of this situation and countless others. In the season of Thanksgiving, we are grateful that we have such a wonderful community in Audubon Park. We are also grateful for the men and women of this department who work hard every day and night to ensure that this remains a great place to work and live.
