Significant Activity in Audubon Park

January was off to a busy start with the first report of the year being taken on 1/7/23. Tools were taken from the open bed of a pickup truck and from inside the unlocked cab. On 1/17/2023, we were dispatched to a vacant house because there was an unfamiliar vehicle parked in the driveway. With the assistance of LMPD K-9, Detective Tim Snook and Major Cheri Bower located two individuals inside the house. Both individuals were taken into custody and charged with Burglary and one was also charged with Possession of Controlled Substances. A duties only domestic violence report was taken on 1/26/2023. A duties only report means that there was no physical violence, but the potential for the situation to escalate exists.

Recently, we received a notice from Kentucky State Police that handwritten citations will no longer be accepted if they contain traffic violations only. For our officers to be able to comply with this, we will have to purchase 3 more computers for vehicles. This will give us computer capability in all of our vehicles. The cost per unit is approximately \$4,500.00. That estimate includes the computer, docking station, printer, secure internet device for NCIC purposes and installation. With Council's approval, I would like to complete installation on 2 vehicles this fiscal year from my existing equipment budget and the third one in the next fiscal year. As always, we appreciate the support of the Mayor and the Council. We are also always looking for ways to improve. If you have ideas or suggestions, please, feel free to reach out to me.
