Significant Activity in Audubon Park

July started off with a BANG! The Independence Day Parade was a success. The turnout of residents was fantastic and the storms took a break long enough for us finish the parade and remain dry. Thank you to Mayor Bozeman and the council for the hard work that was put in to make the day a success. We followed up the parade with the fireworks display hosted by the Audubon Country Club. After last year's display, it was suggested that we shut Cardinal Drive to vehicle traffic. Everyone seemed to enjoy the event and we provided a safe environment for residents who chose to join us.

The rest of the month continued to be busy as we responded to a lot of calls for service and took a lot of reports. . A resident reported that her bicycle was removed from her unlocked garage. The resident was uncertain regarding the time frame of the theft. Another resident reported that items were removed from her unlocked garage. All of the items were located behind her neighbor's storage shed and returned to the resident. A 3rd resident reported that items were taken from his unlocked garage possibly while he was on vacation. A house/dog sitter was staying in the home during the time of the theft.

A resident reported that jewelry was stolen from inside her residence by an unknown subject. There was no forced entry to the household and no unusual footage caught on the camera system. Victim is uncertain regarding the time frame of the theft and believes it could have occurred as early as May 2023. All items taken were sentimental family items. A handgun and prescription medication that was stored in the same location were untouched.

A resident was the victim of a check washing scam. Items of mail that she sent through the US Postal Service were stolen. The checks were washed and altered. Another resident was a victim of identity theft. His information was used by an unknown individual to purchase an I-phone and a Verizon service plan.

Detective Murdoch is following up on all of these cases.

In addition to the theft related cases, we responded to three domestic situations. In the first, a female was arrested for Criminal Trespass after refusing to leave her former boyfriend's residence. In the second, a woman was threatened by her estranged husband. A report was made and an emergency protective order was advised. Officers also responded to an altercation between a father and son that resulted in injuries. The son was arrested for assault 4 domestic violence, resisting arrest (after trying to fight the officer) and alcohol intoxication.
