Significant Activity in Audubon Park

August was a little less quiet in Audubon Park. We had one reported crime that actually occurred in Audubon Park. There was a burglary on Curlew. A new resident had taken possession of the house and began to move items in. Someone likely watched the moving in activity and saw that the house was unoccupied and broke in removing tools and other items. It was not a good way to meet a new resident, but they were pleased with the police response and are excited about moving into Audubon Park. Detective Snook is following up on this case.

While that was the only crime that occurred inside Audubon Park, we had another that affected one of our residents. An envelope containing a payment in the form of a check was placed in the outdoor mailbox at Shelby Station Post Office. Entry was gained to the box with an unauthorized key and an entire bin of mail matter was stolen. Once the check was located, it was "washed" and the information on the check was altered. Our resident has taken appropriate steps to protect all banking and credit accounts. We have alerted residents and asked them to use the secured indoor mailboxes. Detective Snook is working with the Postal Inspector on this case.

There were two arrests in August in Audubon Park. On August 23, a female was arrested after loitering in a yard on Valley. It was determined that she had an outstanding warrant for shoplifting and she was transported to Louisville Metro Corrections. On August 30th, Officer Mike Murdoch heard what sounded like a gunshot coming from the area behind the Country Club. While investigating, he was informed by LMPD that a male had fled along the railroad tracks on a moped and the moped striking the tracks had made the sound. Officer Murdoch located the stolen moped and turned it over to LMPD. After leaving the railroad tracks, Officer Murdoch located the suspect walking North on Preston. He was detained and was found to be in the possession of a stolen handgun and a large bag of methamphetamine. He was arrested and charged with several felonies. A great
