Significant Activity in Audubon Park

September started with the two crimes that occurred outside Audubon Park. Two different residents dropped mail that contained checks into the mailbox at the Shelby Station Post Office. Almost identical to our report in August, the mail was unlawfully taken from the box and the checks were washed. The information was altered, and fraud was committed. There have been no updates from the Postal Inspector who has the lead on these cases. In addition, we had a break in to an unsecured garage. Detective Snook has been doing follow up on this case as well as following up on two domestic violence cases that both resulted in arrests.

I sent an email a few weeks ago letting you know about some personnel changes. So far, we have not added any new officers. The schedule is being evaluated to determine what changes we need to make in manpower. You will continue to have round the clock coverage in the City of Audubon Park and we promise to bring you professional officers who will be great assets to the community.

We are so thankful that we were able to introduce our new patrol vehicle at the Auktoberfest and it is now being used for daily patrol. It is the first time that a new vehicle has been purchased for the police department since 2010. We could not have done it without the Mayor and the City Council. We have gotten so many positive comments on the new graphics. You should have also started seeing the unmarked vehicles with the new magnets. Our goal is to increase visibility and to improve the overall image of the department. As always, we are grateful for the support of the council as we work to improve. We appreciate you!
