

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES REPORT**

March 2019

The weather in March was depressing. Twenty-two days with rain and Three days of snow. UGH! My command staff and our new Code Enforcement Officer, Otto Mock, invites you to join us on Saturday May 25<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 A.M. for coffee and pastries at Audubon Park City Hall. Please come meet us and chat about any topic you want. We look forward to seeing you there! We had some criminal activity in Audubon Park during March. Here is a brief summary of activity:

**Reported Crime:** There were 3 reported crimes for the month of March. Two thefts from vehicles (both unlocked) in the 3100 block of Chickadee and one Burglary in the 3300 block of Robin Road. IPAD and Laptop computer were among the items stolen out of two unlocked vehicles. We believe the suspects were spooked by the Late watch Officer because these items were found in a yard in the area. The only stolen items in the Burglary was personal documents to include a Passport. The girlfriend is the only suspect. There was no forced entry and she is the only one with a key to the apartment. One report for Domestic Violence was taken.

**Traffic Violations:** Police conducted eight traffic stops and all were given warnings.

**Parking Citations:** Seven Parking Citations were written for "No Parking from 0200 to 0600." We get many repeat offenders on this.

**Suspicious Persons:** We stopped Eight non-residents of Audubon Park we believe were in the neighborhood with the intent to commit a crime. Two of those suspicious persons had misdemeanor theft warrants.

**Sad news to report:** Detective Lieutenant Ray Patterson had a stroke on April 5<sup>th</sup>. He also has New Moya in both lungs. Initially his speech was very slurred, left side of face drooping, and very minimal control of right hand. His speech is much better now, he can pick up a glass of water and pencil with right hand. He is lacking the ability to write. Since Ray is still in the very early stages the verdict is still out on the severity. Please keep Ray and his family in your prayers.
