

POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES REPORT

August 2019

Crime was low in Audubon Park during August. This follows a low crime during July. June had a higher than usual crime rate, and the police department is proud to be back in the low crime category. The police department followed through with our promise to conduct enforcement details at the beginning of the school year. We spent Forty-eight hours concentrating on Traffic enforcement. These enforcement details led to thirty-four traffic stops. Police cited eight vehicles, and twenty-six verbal warnings was given. Most of the verbal warning was for vehicles traveling 5-7 mph over the speed limit. Police will continue speeding enforcement details until further notice. The details will be more sporadic vs every day. Here is a brief synopsis of the police forces activity for August:

Reported Crime: Criminal Mischief from domestic dispute (Suspect Arrested). Theft of Mail Matter from a business on Preston Highway (Suspect Arrested). Theft of Mail Matter on Thrush. Package was stolen from porch. No leads on this case.

Traffic Violations: Police conducted Thirty-Four traffic, wrote eight tickets, and gave twenty-six warnings.

Parking Citations: Ten Parking Tickets written for "overnight parking" and three Parking Tickets written for "parking on the grass." Three courtesy notices written for parking violations.

Suspicious Persons: We stopped Ten non-residents of Audubon Park we believe we're in the neighborhood with the intent to commit a crime.

Audubon Park Police hosted a cookout in August. We had over forty residents attend the cookout. Due to the success and positive response from the residents who attended; we plan on hosting a cookout for the community annually.
