## POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES REPORT September 2019

September was the busiest month the police force has had in the 6 years I have been Chief / Deputy Chief at Audubon Park. Many hours were spent planning, preparing, and implementing a traffic plan for the three-weekend music festivals, city-wide yard sale, and Oktoberfest. The traffic plan for the yard sale was the hardest obstacle. Feedback from the community has been very positive from the yard sale. Every resident I spoke to that hosted a yard sale wants it to be an annual event. The fairgrounds raised parking to \$20.00 a car at the fairgrounds during these events. Signage and increased patrol were utilized to prevent people from using Audubon Park for free parking during these events. Officers were posted at the Preston Hwy entrance during peak times to deter criminal activity from entering Audubon Park. It worked! Here is a summary of police activity for September:

Reported Crime: ID Theft for line of Credit (Victim suffered no monetary loss). Damage to vehicle from an attempted break-in.

Traffic Violations: Police conducted Twenty-two traffic stops, wrote four tickets, and gave eighteen warnings.

Parking Citations: Nine Parking Tickets written for "overnight parking." Two courtesy notices written for parking violations.

Suspicious Persons: We stopped Eighteen non-residents of Audubon Park we believe we're in the neighborhood with the intent to commit a crime.

Officer Tim Snook arrested two suspects for Theft related crimes. Police cleared six active cases in Audubon Park from these arrests. We have evidence dating back to April 4th of this year on "RING" cameras identifying these suspects committing crimes.
