

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES REPORT**

April 2019

There were no reported crimes for the month of April in Audubon Park. This is what we strive for. Crime has seen a sharp increase in the area surrounding us during the past month. **Reported Crime:** No crime to report in Audubon Park for April. However, a house on Hess Lane was Burglarized two times and had 3 handguns stolen during burglary. The Burglar first time in the house (stole 3 handguns) did not realize the victims had cameras during his first burglary of the house. The Burglar left a rifle during the first burglary that he wanted to steal. The very next morning after the victims of Burglary left for work, the burglar was across the street waiting for them to leave. After they left, burglar kicked in the rear door of house. APPD had a quick response. Burglar was in the house still in house upon their arrival. APPD located Burglar in house and gave loud verbal command for the Burglar to show his hands. Burglar did not comply and fled out front door. Burglar was caught and taken into custody about 250 yards from the burglarized house. APPD was given a full confession from burglar suspect for the crimes committed. Good Day
