POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES REPORT

July 2019

July was a nice quiet month as it relates to crime Audubon Park. After having a rise in crime in June, we added extra patrols trying to be more visible and it appears to have worked. The police will be putting more of an emphasis on speeding enforcement the next couple of months with school starting up again. Here is a brief synopsis of the police forces activity for July:

Reported Crime: No reported crime.

- Traffic Violations: Police conducted fifteen traffic stops and gave fourteen warnings.
- Parking Citations: Six Parking Tickets were written for overnight parking.
- Suspicious Persons: We stopped twelve non-residents of Audubon Park we believe were in the neighborhood with the intent to commit a crime. Two of the non-residents stopped had committed a wave of crimes in our area. LMPD was able to link these two suspects to nine crimes. During an interview they told officers they walked through Audubon Park a few times, but always saw a police car. We do not believe these two suspects committed any of the crimes in June in Audubon Park based on our interviews.
