Significant Activity in Audubon Park

January was a thankfully quite month. Our first and only offense report in the city was on January 31st. This was a daytime burglary report. The resident reported someone entered the home by breaking a rear window and removing an iPad, one necklace, and several pairs of glasses. Numerous other expensive items and firearms were not taken. Two suspicious people that were reported to have been seen in the area were located a few hours later on Preston Highway. Officers spoke with the subjects who were compliant. It appears they were not involved in the burglary. The case remains under investigation by our Detective.

A committee involving myself, retired Chief Laun, Assistant Chief O'Donnell, and the two Sergeants selected Officer Tommy Davis as the Officer of the Year for 2023. His endless commitment to public safety is on display every day that he comes to work.
