## POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES REPORT

January 2018

There was no reported property crime in Audubon Park during January. Here is a recap of the Police Department's other activities of note:

- "Traffic Safety" is continually being addressed. Officers stopped 23 vehicles for traffic violations, issuing 16 warnings and seven tickets. The worst violator was operating a motor vehicle 45 MPH in our 25 MPH zone.
- Patrol was stepped up at 900 Audubon Parkway due to a complaint of a suspicious vehicle. The vehicle was a white Chevy Impala. Complaint was posted on Facebook and Nextdoor to alert residents. Officers parked their patrol car at the location and did a walk-through of the parking lot and grounds, to include the TARC stop at the Audubon Parkway entrance. The vehicle was no longer at the scene, and has not been reported again.
- Complaint of another suspicious vehicle, a black Mustang, also was made at the same location. The vehicle was spotted nearby, and a traffic stop conducted. The traffic stop resulted in a felony arrest, and seizure of methamphetamine, marijuana, and various drug paraphernalia.
- Options for additional stop signs on Cardinal Drive are being evaluated, with courtesy expert input recently from the responsible Metro traffic official. The unsigned location at the intersection of Cardinal and Robin, and at least one other further east on Cardinal may be feasible.
- I met with the General Manager of Audubon Country Club regarding liquor service. Safety tips and a message from me will be posted to all members and staff of the Club in its March newsletter.
